




Recent Events in the Library

All Year 7 pupils participated in shadowing the award for illustration.




E-Platform

Young Editors is an opportunity for pupils to get involved in the publishing process for upcoming Barrington Stoke books. These books target reluctant readers. Pupils are given a pre-publication manuscript which they read and comment on. The feedback process is quite detailed focusing on a range of different as aspects of the story including character, setting, plot and use of language and speech.




Science Have Taken Over the Library

In April the Science Department took over the library displays with their reading choices, including Science based fiction and non-fiction.


