## **GCSE DRAMA**

GCSE Drama gives pupils the opportunity to explore the subject from a range of perspectives: by devising their own, original work; by bringing to life the work of a playwright; as theatre reviewers, developing their own thoughts on what makes drama and theatre successful; and as creative artists building and bringing a character to life through exploration and rehearsal. This is essentially a practical subject with lots of exciting performing opportunities and regular theatre trips. An ability to work well in groups is an essential requirement.

The qualification is made up of three components:

- (i) **Two non-examination assessments** (60% of the overall qualification)
- (ii) One examination assessment (40% of the overall qualification)
- (iii) Theory and practical work will be integrated throughout the course and all texts studied will be explored practically



## What to expect in the non-examination assessments (60% of the qualification)

Component 1: Devising Drama	Component 2: Text Performance

Pupils will create a <b>devised</b> performance in groups. They will be able to select a starting point from a range of stimuli provided by the examination board. All performances will be supported by a <b>portfolio</b> which is evidence of the pupils' devising process and can be a made up of a combination of writing, images, observation notes and artefacts.	Pupils will study a <b>text</b> chosen by the Drama Department. Pupils will participate in <b>performances</b> of <b>two</b> <b>extracts</b> from the text. Pupils will be required to produce an accompanying concept document which outlines their intentions for the performance.

## What to expect in the exam assessment (40% of the qualification)

The examination component will be assessed at the end Year 11 and will be **1 hour and 30 minutes** in length. Pupils will have to complete two compulsory sections:
